



## Teaching and Learning Lead Governor Terms of Reference

A prime function of the Lead Governor and/or Vice Lead Governor is to review the progress, performance, achievement and attainment of pupils as a cohort. The objectives are to:

### Children

- Monitor the Curriculum
- Monitor and analyse the Pupil Assessment Data
- Monitor and analyse the Progress Score at end of KS2
- Agree the targets for Key Stage 2
- Ensure that Ofsted recommendations are implemented
- Review and monitor the Pupil Development aspects of the School Improvement Plan
- Ensure liaison with the School Council
- Monitor out of school clubs – breadth and attendance
- Monitor other areas of pupil development including, but not limited to, the impact of IT provision and the engagement of parents with learning
- Report to the Full Governing Body on the above

### Curriculum

- To ensure that the curriculum provided meets statutory requirements, including those for reporting
- To ensure regular review of the aims of the school curriculum in relation to the National Curriculum requirements, Religious education, Collective Worship and Sex Education
- To advise on ways in which Governors can be involved in curriculum aspects of the school improvement plan
- To monitor the impact of curriculum policies and planning on children's learning
- To regularly review the assessment policy
- To prepare or review any curriculum policy document which is the responsibility of the Governing Body
- To receive reports from the Governor responsible for the Special Educational Needs and to ensure that the provision for pupils with special needs are made
- To receive information that is required to be published about results and standards
- Review curriculum policies as and when appropriate
